A Message from Our Pastor:

Prayer in Christianity is very different from prayer in other religions. The biggest difference lies in the object of prayer. The One we beseech is not a god high above, but a very close and intimate Father. Our God is not a harsh or irritable judge, but a merciful Father who always opens His arms to embrace us. Therefore, when we come to the Lord, we must eliminate fear and sincerely open our hearts to receive the love that God offers. We also need to firmly believe that prayer is not just about asking for this or that. God knows exactly what we lack. The fundamental inner attitude needed when praying is complete trust in God as a loving Father, who is very generous and full of mercy. When we come to the Lord, He embraces us with loving arms. He also places us on His shoulders. In the loving arms of the Lord, we have no reason to be afraid.

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches about the necessity and effectiveness of asking in prayer. We must pray continually, never becoming weary or losing heart. The Lord uses a parable to illustrate this: the unjust judge who meets a persistent widow.

The widow was lonely and helpless but persistent and determined; she firmly believed that by pleading and begging, the judge would eventually agree to hear her case. The judge was someone who neither feared God nor respected anyone, yet he still yielded to the widow. He ruled in her favor not out of love or responsibility but out of fear of being disturbed. If an ungodly, unjust judge is moved to grant the plea of a beggar, how much more will God, the righteous and just one who rewards and punishes fairly, the compassionate one who always supports the humble who call upon Him!

When Jesus told this parable, Jesus did not mean that one must pray persistently to have God answer, but He wanted us to trust in the power of prayer, because "Which one of you would hand his son a stone when he asks for a loaf of bread, or a snake when he asks for a fish? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good things to those who ask him" (Mt 7:9-11).

Prayer is the breath of the soul, the life, the strength of a Christian. A faith without prayer is merely a selfish, material belief. Prayer is the meaning of life. Prayer holds a special importance in life. Prayer only truly has value and power when it stems from a faith that is of quality and alive. When praying, the mind is lifted up to God to praise, glorify, adore, repent, and ask for grace. The highest level of prayer is: "not my will, but yours be done" (Lk. 22:42). God is a loving and merciful Father, ready to grant us the necessary blessings. However, because He is a loving

Father, He does not grant everything we ask for. He knows what is good and beneficial to give us. Our duty is to trust, persevere, and pray diligently. Let us pray every day, before going to bed, upon waking, when going to work, before eating. Let us pray continually and never lose heart.

Lord Jesus, grant that we always love the life of prayer; grant that we firmly believe that by our own strength, we can do nothing, but with Your grace, we can do many good things in daily life. Amen.
